Go Fetch - 2 or more people

One person calls out 'Go fetch something...', and then a colour. Then you run and fetch something of that colour as fast as you can. For example 'Go Fetch something Green'. If you have an extra player, it can be a race! Try changing the colours for first letters, or perhaps pick describing words such as big, small, squashy, spiky or waterproof!



Back to back - 2 people

Spend 60 seconds looking at another person (and it's OK to laugh.) Then turn your backs. Now change 3 small things about the way you look, (it could be untying a shoelace, removing a sock or changing your hair). Turn back to face each other and guess what changes have been made.



Crafty Ideas

Summer is such a great time for adventures, imagination and fun. Jack LOVES to play outdoors. Here are some ideas...

Make an assault course

In the house/garden/park using cushions as stepping stones, chairs to go over, tables to go under, twigs to run around...check with an adult first before you borrow things!



Make a Self portrait

Use natural items you find on a walk (leaf/sticks/stones etc) to construct a picture/collage of yourself or anything you like!

Build a den

Grab pegs, chairs, bedsheets, cushions. Are you making a story den? A rainforest tree house? A shelter? Can you be characters in the den?

Make your own aquarium



Making your aquarium

- 1. Ask an adult to cut a large rectangle from the front of the cereal box (keep the cut out bit).
- 2. Paint the inside of the cereal box blue, and the outside your favourite colour.
- **3.** If you can, collect sand and pebbles from the park and put them on the bottom of your box.
- 4. Draw, cut out and paint/ some long plant leaves and stick them in.

You will need

Cereal Box String/cotton/wool Scissors (Ask an adult) Paint/felt tips Glue or Sellotape


Your aquarium pets

- 1. On the back of the card from earlier, draw and cut out some sea creatures that live underwater—ask an adult to help with the cutting.
- 2. Paint or colour your fish in your favourite colours.
- **3.** Stick some string to the fish and hang them up from inside.

Hey presto – your very own awesome aquarium!


Farm animals

The goose that lays golden eggs


In the story, Jack finds a goose that lays golden eggs! Draw around your hand on a piece of paper. Add an eye and a beak to your thumb. Then use lots of colours and patterns to make it a magical goose.

Make a beanstalk

Draw a spiral on the enclosed green card and ask a grown up to help you cut it out.
This is your twisty beanstalk.
On the other coloured paper, draw lots of leaves and create designs on them. Cut out the leaves and stick them on your beanstalk. Hang it up by looping it over a door handle or the back of a chair.
