


You are visiting a theatre called Nottingham Playhouse.

The Foyer and chill-out space




People wait to see the show in the foyers.

This is what the bars look like.


The Main Stage

Joseph is taken into hospital. Two people decide that Joseph should stay in a private room in the attic of the hospital. Scientists examine Joseph's body and describe it in medical terms.



Nurse Willison washes Joseph. Joseph talks to her. She is surprised. No one knows he can speak.



Joseph and Nurse Willison go to the hospital courtyard. He is introduced to Miss Fordham, a young woman. She is another patient at the hospital. She encourages Joseph to leave the hospital and go into the city.

An actress called Mrs Highfield visits Joseph in the hospital. She is playing Esmerelda in The Hunchback of Notre Dame. Nurse Glyndon tells Joseph that she has seen Mrs Highfield's play. She also tells Joseph about a hospital ball. She dances with Joseph but then tells him he is not invited to the ball.




Joseph finds out that Miss Fordham has died. He talks to the morgue porter about what will happen to her body. The porter tells him that her skeleton will be donated to science.
