

Nottingham Playhouse Call Out for Writer and Composer

The Little Mermaid

Every Christmas, Nottingham Playhouse produces a family show aimed at children aged 3-8 in the Neville Studio. The production then tours to primary schools, libraries and other community settings in the region.

We are very proud that this production provides a vital experience for younger children, many visiting a theatre for the first time. It is a core part of our Christmas programme and has been building a reputation year on year.

For the 2025/26 production we are producing *The Little Mermaid* and we're looking for a Writer and Composer to commission.

You may be:

- A playwright
- A composer
- Part of a writer and composer duo
- A writer and a composer

We welcome applications from all of the above. You can apply individually or as part of a duo. Please make this clear in your application.

The Director will also be recruited via an open callout.

The Brief

The play must run at around 50 minutes.

The final version will include original songs. If applying as an individual writer or composer, who writes the lyrics will be discussed at the interview stage.

There will be two actors in the production. The logistics of this should be taken into account.

The play must be suitable for children aged 3–8, and their families.

The production tours to school halls and often has 30 minutes to set up.

The above parameters aren't intended to limit your imagination, but keep the feasibility of this at the back of your mind.

For the last four years, we have included elements of embedded access such as integrated creative captioning into the production and will do so again this year.



For the fourth year, the production will be designed and produced following the sustainability standard Baseline, as outlined in the Theatre Green Book.

Fee

The contract offered will be in line with the ITC Theatre Writers' Commissioning Agreement for a play of under 70 minutes, currently a minimum fee of £6,110, split between the writer and composer as appropriate.

Please note that this is the basic fee and depending on the split of writing, lyric writing, music writing and musical direction as part of the show, it will be subject to an increase, up to a maximum of £8,300, if split between a writer and composer. The final fee and split will be worked out with the successful applicants.

Reasonable expenses will be payable in addition to the fee if applicable. Travel expenses will not be paid if the Writer or Composer lives within 25 miles of Nottingham Playhouse.

The Writer

We are looking for a professional writer.

The successful writer will be expected to deliver to agreed deadlines, collaborate with the director and creative team, attend key rehearsal dates and make amendments to the script as necessary.

The Composer

We are looking for a professional composer who has experience of working with professional performers as either a lead artist or assistant.

The composer also acts as the production's Musical Director and will be required to teach the cast the songs and create any necessary backing tracks.

The Composer will also be responsible for sound effects and the small-scale sound design for the Production.

The successful Composer will be expected to deliver to agreed deadlines, collaborate with the director and creative team, attend key rehearsal dates and make amendments to the music as necessary.

Selection Process

Your application will be assessed by a panel of theatre professionals, including Artistic Director, Adam Penford.

We may then invite selected candidates to meet to discuss their application.



How to Apply

The Little Mermaid is a well-known tale. It's up to you to choose what to focus on, how you tell the story and what to leave out.

If you are a writer, please submit:

- A treatment/rough outline for your adaptation of *The Little Mermaid* (no more than one side of A4 in length).
- One scene (between 2-5 pages) from any part of the story.
- A previous play (produced or unproduced) as an example of your writing, (this can be any length or genre).
- A completed Equal Opportunities Monitoring Form, downloadable from our website.

Please indicate if you are applying jointly with a composer.

If you are a composer, please submit:

- Approx. 300 words on why this specific production (*The Little Mermaid*) interests you as a composer.
- A couple of sentences indicating any previous Musical Directing experience.
- A link to some examples of your previous work as a composer
- A completed Equal Opportunities Monitoring Form, downloadable from our website.

Please indicate if you are applying jointly with a writer.

If you are applying jointly or as a writer-composer, please submit all of the above.

The Equal Opportunities monitoring form will be separated from the application and does not form part of the selection process. Information obtained from the form will not be available for the people preparing the shortlist with the exception of obtaining information about disability required to make reasonable adjustments for meetings. Data obtained from the forms will be used solely for monitoring purposes and no one individual can ever be identified.

Dates

The deadline for the first draft of the script will be late May 2025.

The rehearsal draft (including songs) deadline will be at the start of September 2025. Rehearsals begin 10 November 2025.

Dress rehearsals, previews and press performance will be the week commencing 1 December 2025.
