Ollie is an actor, comedian and clown based in London. He trained at the renowned École Philippe Gaulier in France and was a member of the National Youth Theatre REP Company in 2015.

Recent credits include Scrooge in Rouge (The Old Joint Stock), The Dazzle (Menagerie Theatre) and Treeeee (Leicester UK Kids Festival). He also recently worked on Esme's Life Suck, which is currently touring film festivals internationally.

As a comedian, Ollie was a finalist in the Leicester Square Theatre Sketch Off, nominated for Best Debut and Best Kids Show at the Leicester Comedy Festival, and winner of The Blackout at Up The Creek. He performs regularly at leading UK comedy venues including The Pleasance, Angel Comedy, Soho Theatre and Brighton Komedia. Ollie is a founding member of the award-nominated clown company Big Zeus Energy and was Artist in Residence at the Centre for Artistic Development in Calgary. He also facilitates clown workshops throughout Europe.

CREATIVES

Joe Venable Writer/Composer

Joe Venable (he/him) is a theatre lyricist and book-writer, with a passion for playful musicals that make people believe they may in fact enjoy going to the theatre. He keenly advocates for social change in his writing, centring themes of greed, overwork, injustice and empathy.

His first show On Your Bike, about food delivery riders caught in a rivalry between two chicken shops, debuted at the Edinburgh Fringe in 2021, winning 'Best Musical at the Fringe' from Musical Theatre Review and returning for another five-star run in 2023. His subsequent shows Jingle Street, about an ad writer who wakes up to find he can only speak in jingles, and Rishi Sunak's Doing A Musical, a satire written in just six weeks for the 2024 election, also premiered to critical acclaim in 2023 and 2024.

He's currently working on No Flirting in the Bunker Please, a musical about two teenagers falling in love after a nuclear apocalypse, heading to the Edinburgh Fringe in 2026. He lives in London with his wife and many small spiders he does not appreciate.

Rob Gathercole Musical Director, Composer and Lyrics

Rob is an actor, musician, composer and writer. He co-wrote and performed in the 2024 election spoof, Rishi Sunak's Doing A Musical! He also wrote and performed in the Offie Award-nominated Faking Bad, a parody musical of the hit TV series Breaking Bad, playing Hank, Mike, Saul, Jane, Hector, Don Eladio, Todd, Elliot & Teeny Weeny Walt. Recently, Rob provided musical arrangements for the Edinburgh Fringe smash hit A Jaffa Cake Musical, and he is working on a new comedy musical The Sesh with Rebecca Simmonds.

Outside of his original musical projects, Rob is resident composer and musical director for Immersion Theatre, writing music for all eight of their family musicals and providing music for their pantomimes.

As an actor, he recently appeared in Bruiser Theatre Company's Murder for Two, Gigglemug Theatre's Scouts the Musical! and two UK tours of Dreamboats and Petticoats.
